The M.A.E. in Elementary Teaching offers candidates the opportunity to earn New Jersey teacher certification as a K-6 elementary teacher. The program is delivered through the combination of online, hybrid, and weekend offerings to address the needs of career changers. Clinical experiences are required including one semester of full-time internship (five days a week). Designed for those committed to entering the profession of education through a rigorous program, in a format that works for adult learners, the timeframe is one year from beginning to graduation.

Admissions Requirements

An offer of admission is required to matriculate in the M.A.E. Elementary Teaching program. Applicants must submit the following materials:

- Online application and application fee
- Official transcripts from all institutions attended, reflective of an undergraduate bachelor's-level cumulative grade point average of 3.0 GPA and inclusive of at least 60 credits in Liberal Arts
- Official score report indicating passing score on the Praxis II exam
- Personal statement
- Resume/Curriculum vitae

Application Deadline

The program reviews applications on a rolling basis and generally accepts applicants for students to begin their studies in the Summer semester (typically beginning in mid-May).
