

PROFESSIONAL COUNSELING (ED.S.)

This program is designed for individuals who have completed either Seton Hall's M.A. in Counseling or M.A. in School Counseling program and wish to pursue a licensure as a professional counselor. Depending upon the student's area of study, the Ed.S. program is comprised of additional advanced-level practice and knowledge courses, specifically 12 credits for M.A. in Counseling students and 15 credits for M.A. in School Counseling students.

Note: The Ed.S. degree requires separate application and is currently available only to students who have completed the M.A. in Counseling or M.A. in School Counseling requirements from Seton Hall University.
