

# COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES 3+3 BA/JD

The College of Arts and Sciences is excited to announce the launch of a 3+3 combined BA/JD Program in collaboration with Seton Hall Law School. This innovative program allows students to complete their undergraduate and law degrees in six years instead of the traditional seven years. Students will complete their undergraduate coursework in approximately three years and then proceed to law school, receiving their bachelor's degree after the first year of law school. The program includes various disciplines such as Anthropology, English, History, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, Religious Studies, Spanish, Social Work, and Sociology. Other BA program students can also participate by consulting with their academic advisors.

## Admission Requirements

Freshman Admission:

- High School GPA: 3.6 or higher
- SAT: 1200 (or ACT: 27), with a Critical Reading score of 600
- Maintenance Requirements: Maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.50 throughout undergraduate studies and achieve a 156 LSAT score

Junior Year Admission:

- Credit Requirement: Complete at least 90 undergraduate credits within three years
- GPA: Maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.50
- LSAT: Must meet the average LSAT score requirements for admitted students at Seton Hall Law School

Upon acceptance, students will transition to law school in their fourth year, where they will complete the first-year law curriculum of 30 credits. After this fourth year, students will be awarded their BA and then complete the remaining two years of law school to obtain their JD.

## Social Work

SOWK majors must complete 99 undergraduate credits: the University Core (16 credits), the A&S Core (38 credits) and the SOWK major (45 credits). Note: Students will use SOWK 2201 (Social Problems and Programs) and SOWK3201 (Social Welfare Policy) to fulfill the A&S core social science requirements (6 credits). In addition, student should select a social work diversity requirement from A&S Core (religion, philosophy, or history approved courses). BIOL 1101 Introduction to Biology, PSYC 1101 Introduction to Psychology, SOCI 1101 Introduction to Sociology, and MATH 1203 Stats Models for Soc Science should also be taken as part of the A&S Core.

A BSW will also provide students with advanced standing status in a Masters in Social Work (MSW) program at any accredited social work graduate program as long as they enroll within 2 years after graduating from law school. A MSW can be completed in one year with advanced standing status.
